## Pro Bono and Not for Profit Scholarship

## **Eligibility & Criteria**

- 1. To be eligible for the Scholarship, a candidate:
  - Must be a lawyer holding a current Australian practising certificate (as at the date of their application); and
  - EITHER be employed by the Legal Commission of their State or Territory or a Community Legal Centre; OR be a private practitioner whose practice is at least 75% of work pursuant to a legal aid grant or is pro bono work.
- 2. All decisions concerning eligibility will be made by the Family Law Section Executive in its discretion.
- 3. The Scholarship recipient will be offered a prize package to the value of \$6,000 including:
  - a) Cash prize of \$1,500.

Closing date

- b) Full registration for the 20th National Family Law Conference to be held in Perth on 30 October 2024
- c) One ticket to the Welcome Reception at the National Conference on 29 October 2024
- d) One ticket to each Happy Hour at the National Conference
- e) One ticket to the Gala Dinner at the National Conference
- f) Up to \$1,500 for airfares and accommodation (to be booked through the Family Law Section.)
- g) One FLS membership for 2 years.
- h) 'Winner of the Family Law Section Pro Bono Scholarship 2024' branded stamp.
- 4. All submissions will also be considered for publication in Australian Family Lawyer.
- 5. The Family Law Section reserves the right not to Award the prize if, in the opinion of the judging panel and/ or the Family Law Section Executive, the entries are not of a satisfactory standard.
- 6. To apply for the Scholarship, eligible candidates must
  - Submit a previously unpublished article of approximately 1,500 words (including footnotes, appendices, and tables) on the following topic:

'How I would fix the Australian Family Law System if I was Attorney-General for a day'





- b) Complete the Family Law Section Pro Bono and Not for Profit Scholarship application form found on the Family Law Section website (unless otherwise discussed), and
- c) Be prepared to attend the entire Conference.
- 7. Articles must be entirely the applicant's own work. Al-based technologies, including ChatGPT, are not permitted to be used to create any part of the article.
- 8. References to articles/texts should be included in footnotes with full details. All footnotes, citations, and references should be correct. Please use 11-point font with sensible spacing, and please ensure there is no defamatory, political, or controversial commentary.
- 9. Articles should be submitted in .doc or .docx format.
- 10. The Scholarship will be judged by the Family Law Section Executive.
- 11. It is a condition of the Family Law Section Pro Bono and Not for Profit Scholarship that the recipient will acknowledge the Scholarship in any future publication or presentation of the article.
- 12. Applications and articles for the Scholarship must be received by 1 July 2024. It is expected that the Executive will make its decision by 1 August 2024.
